

MEETING THE SPECIAL NEEDS OF CHILDREN

Dear Windsor Prep Community:

Our school is committed to protecting student, teacher, and staff health. To protect our community and be in compliance with the Department of Education regulations Omega Environmental Services tested our school's drinking water for lead.

Results of our Testing

Following instructions given in technical guidance developed by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, we completed a limited plumbing profile for the Windsor Prep building to identify all drinking water and food preparation outlets. Of the samples taken, only three tested above the lead action level established by the US Environmental Protection Agency for lead in drinking water (15 μ g/l [ppb]).

The table below identifies the drinking water outlets that tested above the 15 μ g/l for lead, the actual lead level, and what temporary remedial action Windsor Prep has taken to reduce the levels of lead at these locations.

Sample Location	First Draw Result in µg/l (ppb)	Remedial Action
1 st Floor Drinking Water Fountain ID # 3	15.3	Disconnected outlet. Alternative fountains available.
2nd Floor Drinking Water Fountain ID # 3	16.7	Disconnected outlet. Alternative fountains available.
2nd Floor Drinking Water Fountain ID # 4	16	Disconnected outlet. Alternative fountains available.

The elevated levels are associated with a first draw sample. Flush samples for each were significantly below action level. In the coming weeks we will be working on solutions to achieve and maintain a reduced lead level in these areas. Follow up testing will be conducted. Only after appropriate remedial measures have been completed and follow up results at acceptable levels will the locations be placed back in service.
